Classes for identified students (i.e. foreign languages, chess, research, pre algebra, drama, clubs)	<p>Pay teacher(s) to get a Level 3 Math Endorsement to teach pre-algebra.</p> <p>Hire a teacher/parent to teach classes in research, chess, foreign language, etc.</p>

Compensation for development and implementation of centers to allow for differentiation for advanced learners	Inservice rate: \$18.30 Cost of resources & materials
Develop specific student talents by utilizing experts in the field (i.e. scientists, mathematicians, architects, etc.)	Contact Salt Lake Community College, University of Utah, etc. to work with individual students/ groups of students.
Field trips that enrich or enhance higher level thinking skills or provide in-depth study for bright students.	While all children will benefit from the field trip, the field trip must meet the needs of a targeted G/T group for in-depth study or understanding.
